PREPPING FOR YOUR FIRST VISIT & A

GATHER YOUR DATA

Before visiting the home, familiarize yourself with essential details about the case.

Tip: If anything is unclear, reach out to the referring party to gather any missing or additional information. Don't hesitate to ask questions!



PREP YOUR MATERIALS

Before heading out, make sure you have all the

necessary materials:

- Assessment forms (e.g., intake, consent forms)
- Tools or therapeutic materials for your session
- Notetaking materials for documenting observations and interactions

DEVELOP A PERSONAL SAFETY PLAN

It's important to ensure your own safety before conducting

in-home visits. Consider the following:

- Share your location or schedule with a supervisor or colleague
- Ensure that your phone is charged and accessible
- Be aware of exits and safety routes in case of emergencies







MAKE CONTACT WITH THE CLIENT

Once you've gathered the necessary data, it's time to reach out to the client or their guardian to schedule the first session. During

this conversation, be sure to ask:

- Are there any safety concerns you should be aware of (e.g., pets, weapons, suspected abuse)?
- Are there any logistical issues (e.g., parking accommodations)?
